He took a cup full of wine and gave thanks to you, saying, "Blessed are you, Lord God of the Universe, who brings forth fruit from the vine."

All: Blessed are you, Lord God of the Universe; everything you have created is blessed.

He took the cup and gave it to his disciples saying, "Take this, all of you, and drink it. This is my blood.

My forever promise to you and to everyone.

Each time you drink, remember me."

All: Blessed are you, Lord God of the Universe; everything you have created is blessed.

Blessed are you, God most holy.

We ask that you would send your Spirit upon this bread and this cup that they, and we, might be the body of Christ—hope in the world, speaking, acting, and living the change that brings healing and wholeness. In this hope, your people praise you:
