Remembrances

Many members of St. Paul's have answered the call to service in the two World Wars and the Korean War.

At the front of the sanctuary to the left of the pulpit there is a Roll of Honour with hand-lettered names of the 105 men and 2 women who served in the Great War. On the right side there is a bronze plaque with the names of the 25 who lost their lives. This memorial plaque was dedicated on Armistice Day, November 11, 1923. It was designed by C. A. McVey, a member of the St. Paul's Presbyterian Church and cast by Birks of Montreal.

In World War II there were 184 members of this congregation who served. There are two memorial windows honouring the 8 who lost their lives. The symbols of the Royal Canadian Navy, Army, Air Force and Army Medical Corps are included in the design. These windows are the third and fourth from the front of the sanctuary on the York Street side.

The Women's Guild recommended the acquisition of the present pipe organ as a memorial to the men and women who had served in the two World Wars.
