- Give it to your treasurer, to Cathy at the church office or call Cathy for more information at 458-1183

- Regular support of your church in the amount that you choose (no fees charged to you)
- Continual support of your home church when you are away
- Avoidance of "catch-up" periods

Advantages to the congregation:

- Regular, dependable flow of contributions
- Reduction of paper work and bookkeeping
